

Residency Program Objectives:

Upon completion of the Residency Program you will be able to:

- Safely provide care for patients in the Acute Care setting.
 - Prioritize patient care based on acuity or urgency of patient needs.
 - Recognize and respond to emergency situations.
 - Recognize abnormal assessments and know when to consult.
 - Administer medications in a safe and timely manner.
 - Access patient education materials and resources.
 - Coordinate care with the healthcare team and outside agencies.
 - Communicate effectively with individuals and groups. .
 - Be part of a nursing team for patients in your community.

What does the Residency consist of?

During the RN Residency program, topics listed below will be conducted in classroom settings, skills labs, and on-the-unit training:

 - Experienced nurses: supply 2 work references: 1 professional, 1 peer.
 - Check with individuals providing references to ensure • that they have been returned to HRH Human Resource by the deadline.
 - New graduates must complete the candidate work • preference selection for interview form.
 - Ensure all documentation is complete and submitted to • Human Resources.
 - Graduation from a registered nursing program.
 - RN NCLEX exam completed for new graduates.
 - Active licensure status.
